He mutters something about not knowing enough about him, and if you believe, Trump has had his head stuck so deeply into trying to run little old ladies out of their property — I mean, everyone in his position knows who David Duke is, unbelievable—the man's a liar! (He made it okay to call him a liar when he started throwing that around about his opponents—you're a liar Trump—LIAR TRUMP, LIAR TRUMP. (wow!))

So, after he had time to work it out with the Duke, then he denounces the KKK and the Duke, but — notice, Duke did not withdraw his endorsement — listen, radical white supremacists support Trump, and it's like a religious thing with them.

These are the people who are slugging those who oppose Trump, at these rallies. Rallies where Trump has said stuff like, "I'd like to punch him in the face, I'll tell ya." [562.27.TRUMP-6] That's Trump.

Put that next to Cruz dealing with a detractor, any number of times, where he calmly, patiently speaks with them, and if they become rude or refuse to listen, he simply says, well, you have a right to your opinion, and I guess we disagree on this, stuff like that.

Or the time he flipped a detractor in Iowa on the ethanol question—

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The contrast cannot be more stark between the orangutan with a bad hair cut and a genuine God fearing patriot—hey, I'm trying to get under the skin of my Trump supporting friends, and I can't wait till one of them comes at me for the name calling thing so I can say, Trump started it! (hahahaha) — Come on!

How many times have you listened or watched Trump and did not think, good night, this guy acts like Teenager — actually, I don't mean to insult teens. He acts like some kid, all puffed up, "nope, nope, he's wrong, he's wrong..." or, you know, putting out the "chops" remember that, "Oooh, what a chop!" That's Trump, some high school chop master putting others down to build himself up.

I really need my Brain Massage regulars to help out the newbies because they are probably about to hyperventilate — so, pass them a bag, help them breath through it then explain — I'm using something called mirroring — it's a technique whereby we bring something about someone to their attention by mirroring the behavior—

The contrast between Trump and Cruz could not be more clear. On one side you have a bully, who says to protestors, "I'd like to punch him in the face, let me tell ya" and whose followers are just like him, and actually do punch their political opponents in the face—exactly the way Hitler's followers physically attacked those who opposed Hitler, by the way—and then, on the other side, you have a gentleman, gracious, calm when attacked, able to maintain his cool and respond to protestors rationally—now, question!

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Trump's crowd gathers and rages with him as he drops his *F* bombs, and revels with him in the gutter language of Hollywood, or the "Unholy-hood." Well, I guess we called it the vadio—same thing in some ways) Anyway, this behavior is not usual among conservatives, at least not among any I know. And Cruz observes this and says, Trump's support is made up of a lot of low information voters. That seems like a fair assessment to me. That's exactly what I'm thinking when I'm watching one of these rowdy Trump rallies.

Trump's response is that he likes the poorly educated!

That's interesting! Apparently that's what he thinks of his crowd. Perhaps he is purposely targeting that demographic—he is rallying the angry underbelly of the electorate to his side—so much so, that many of his early supporters who don't identify with that behavior, who were drawn to him at first because they saw in him a competent business man who would take care of business for America—but they are more and more beginning to see he is becoming the gravitational center of the bitter conservative, and many of them are among those that Liberals typically call the "great unwashed" — and as I watch this, I begin to see that a thought that occurred to me about a month ago about Trump is beginning to form into a conviction in my mind about this man—

Step back, a little farther, come on, help me out here, if you stand too close to some pictures you can't see them properly, and I want to show you something, so step back another three, no about five more steps back from Trump and look at him. What do you see?

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He embodies every stereotype liberals have created about conservatives. He even looks like a caricature of an angry conservative that you might see in a liberal cartoon. Angry, bitter, raging, crude, ignorant, mean spirited, crass — Trump's brand of conservatism looks an awful lot like the caricature of conservatism liberals have created over the last, well, I guess the last 36 years, since Reagan—in my memory, that's when Liberals became insane with their effort to make it out that conservatives wanted old people to eat dog food, children to die of starvation, and everyone else to die of pollution—Trump looks and sounds like the caricature conservative created by liberals — and at the same time, his policies actually have many characteristics of distorted compassion we see in liberalism — with "I'm a liberal when it comes to health care..."

The point here is that Trump thinks of conservatives in exactly the same way liberals do. So he wants to rally the F bombing, bitter, cursing, slugging, liberal stereotype of a "red-neck" "God and gun clinger" — I mean the way the liberal sees them, the "poorly educated" class — Trump says, "I love the poorly educated" — what a thing to say! And I get it — I understand that he considered he was being complimentary and showing appreciation for their support, but he thinks of them as the "poorly educated" — out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks — and so what sort of heart spews out the garbage we hear from Trump?

Trump sees his followers in just the way an elitist New Yorker would see the average man in fly-over country. I mean in the context of being told Cruz believes his followers are made up of a significant number of what we have come to call the low information voter, Trump says, "I love the poorly educated."

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(By the way, for the record — when we talk about low information voters, we are not necessarily saying they are "poorly educated." Low information voters can be people who hold BAs, Masters degrees and even Drs. and Phds — low information voters are people who don't bother looking deeply into the policy positions of the candidates, but make their choice on a superficial knowledge of their positions—on the other hand, it's certainly true that people who are poorly educated are easier to dupe than those who are not, and every CON man knows it's easier to dupe—

Look, Trump has nothing but disdain for his followers—he said they would follow him even if he shot someone in cold blood on a street in Manhattan — what does that tell you about his opinion of his followers?

Trump is a liberal who thinks all he has to do is throw some red meat at the conservative dogs to get them on his side. Sadly, there are enough angry conservatives out there, totally distracted by the red meat so they can't see Trump's record, and these, together with the cross over liberal Dem voters, have given him the edge so far.

But facts are stubborn things, and the fact is two-thirds of conservatives are AGAINST TRUMP, not for him. (It's actually more than two-thirds, you've got to deduct the liberal cross over voters from Trump's margin, and that is likely close to half of his support in these primaries.) Conservatism needs to unite behind Cruz and stop this nonsense right now.

Trump will not get my vote! Carson can compromise his convictions, Carson can swallow the stinky camel called Trump implying he is a pedophile while straining at the gnat over Cruz's campaign repeating something reported on CNN—Carson is an

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anger driven man, and it's so typical for such people to be attracted to anger centered people—besides, Trump does not need my vote, he has the Democrats—unless Kasich and Rubio wake up, we are going to have a socialist on both tickets —

I've written a letter to myself and sealed it in an envelope and mailed it to myself. I'm going to put it away and I'm going to read it to you after the 2016 election and it will shock you how right on I am about this election. Oh yeah!

Hold on through the break — I'll be right back.

Segment.02 Hello. Welcome back! I'm Jerry Scheidbach, pastor at the Lighthouse, your brain masseur, and Paul Revere's lantern lighter, lighting the lamps in the church belfry arch, signaling the enemy is on the march, an enemy that would steal from us our liberty.

I want to do an entire show on TPP and TPA and TAA but I today I need to take a quick look at the 12th GOP debate, but maybe I can salt in some previews of an upcoming show where I deal with that issue thoroughly.

As for my general observations, immediately, the TONE was very changed. FINALLY — and you know what happened there don't you? I heard someone say the reason was that Trump has won and Rubio and Cruz discovered that them piling up on Trump is only driving voters to Trump—don't believe it. That's what Trump supporters will tell you, but don't be fooled. Here is what really happened. They punched the bully in his stinking nose and he has backed off. You saw a much more docile Trump on that stage in Miami — Trump's tone has totally changed! No, that strategy of giving Trump some of his own worked — in exactly the same way

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I shut up several bullies along the way in my life — one good punch in the nose is usually all it takes.

And, hey, the reason Rubio is having trouble in Florida (although, lately he has been surging—and don't remember that Trump always polls high going in—something I'm still studying—Trump is an unorthodox candidate, we know that, I wonder if he is putting his money into getting the polls he wants, but more on that later) but what trouble Rubio has had in his home State has NOTHING TO DO WITH his roughing up the Donald — and everything to do with what's going on everywhere in this primary. That and I think in Florida his voting record as Senator is hurting him, along with the fact that the Tea Party sent him to Washington and he has not consistently supported Tea Party interests—so, it's multilayered.

But, first, Florida is a closed primary—the only way Democrats can vote in the GOP primary is if they switch parties, and there does not seem to be any surge of GOP registrations in Florida—accompanied by a reduction in Dem registrations—fact is, registrations are up in both parties in Florida, and in neither case enough to suggest any sort of major activity like operation chaos is going on.

But anyway, it appears Kasich is going to take Ohio, and the possibility is good that Rubio will take Florida and that could block Trump—but, really, here is what we need to be looking at right now.

If we take CPAC as representative of conservatives in the USA — and I think anyone familiar with CPAC would agree it represents the conservative base in America right now — sponsored by American Conservative Union and the Young Americans for

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Freedom—founded back in the early 70s — embraced Reagan in the 80s — and has grown into a major force for conservatism in America — if we take CPAC as fairly representative of the conservative base in America then Cruz is by far the favorites among CONSERVATIVES.

As you probably know, Trump was invited to speak at CPAC, but dropped out at the last minute - because, frankly, CPAC is not his crowd. White supremacists joining other angry voters bitter at the GOP establishment (understandably, by the way), with a significant number of Lib-Dems, throwing their hand up in a Trump rally to pledge their support of him, shades of Hiel Hitler? — that's his crowd. So Trump was a no show at CPAC - probably the closest thing to a gathering of the conservative BASE in America today —

But, you must remember, that CPAC does not always pick the winner. Nor does CPAC always pick the best conservative—So, I'm not suggesting the CPAC straw poll predicts the nominee, but it does reveal which candidate is most appealing to the conservative base. (As we know, the GOP has not gone with the best conservatives—so, again, I underscore that I'm not saying CPAC always gets it right, but if you look back over their choices, they pick a strong conservative every time one is available. So, here is how the conservative BASE represented by CPAC is divided coming into this election:

CRUZ - 40%

Rubio - 30%

Trump - 15%

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Kasich - 8%

These are important numbers. These numbers are born out by the primary results thus far. You say, no way, Trump is leading. This is my point! He is not leading among conservatives—if you add Rubio and Cruz votes together, and call that the conservative vote, the conservative vote beats Trump. And if you deduct the cross over Lib-Dem that are voting for Trump, as a stop loss plan—because Trump is, as he has often bragged, well liked by liberals—then Trumps support among conservatives is even less.

The Democrats are electing our candidate again. In the past they have done it by media pressure on the elitists to moderate their choice to someone more agreeable to the Dems — that wont work this year because people are disgusted with the GOP aristos and the media—so here comes the Trumpster.

Let's run through the debate. I'll try to focus on parts where some useful insight is made available to us.

Let's begin with the opening comments: I'll summarize my take on their opening remarks in the order they were given.

Kasich - I'm going to send money and power to your state.

Rubio - This election is about our identity as a nation and as a people — if we get it right, our children will be prosperous and the 21st century will be a new American century (Whatever that means!)

Cruz — My Dad came here from Cuba at 18 years of age with dreams and hopes, “yet he was in the freest land on the face of the earth” — This debate, and election, is not about insults, or attacks, or any individual, it's about you and your children—freedom—and

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getting government out of the way of hard-working Americans. (Substantive, and focused.)

Trump — It's exciting, it's awesome, every body is coming out (for me) everybody, we are getting democrats, we are getting independents, it's great, it's exciting, they are voting out of enthusiasm (for me) they are voting out of love (for me) — if the establishment had any sense, they would know a good deal when they see it namely, (me) — and, we are going to win, we will win, we will win, win, win, cause (I'm a winner). So, it's great! It'll be great, and I'll make America great, because well, I'm great!

Hahaha. That's Trump. All static electricity—a high energy smoke generator — blowing smoke in your face, while in back room deals, cause he is the DEALER, he is negotiating a settlement, and you can't always get what you want — so, come on, you know that! I'm going to start my bid high, and negotiate it down, cause I'm a deal maker —

What I found outstanding in these opening statements is this — for Cruz and Rubio, it's all about you, it's about America, it's about freedom, for Kasich — I agreed with what he said, in fact, he is right on, sending power back to the States is exactly what needs to happen, exactly as Cruz has repeatedly indicated he will do, but I found it sad, because it came across to me like he was trying a Dem trick of calling the pigs to the government trough — don't get me wrong, he is right on with the idea of transferring power back to the States, but it came across like, vote for me 'cause I'll send money to your state — but, Trump — with Trump it's all about me, it's all about I, it's all about — you've heard the song — you hear it every time Trump opens his mouth.

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Trump is having people raise their hand to pledge their support to him — heil hitler! hiel hitler!

My God, I'm watching Hitler rise in America.

Trump tries to dance around his praise of China's action in Tiananmen Square — “strong” does not mean good? Really? It always means that when it's about him, you know, how he will be a “strong” leader. He always means this as a compliment. Remember — he complimented Obama saying he has the marks of being a “strong leader.”

Liberals envy strong leaders — remember, Sean Penn admired Chavez because he was a "strong leader" — liberals drool over the power dictators get to wield over their countrymen — look how Obama uses his power — Trump will be Obama on steroids.

He admires the Mussolini quote: “Better to live one day as a lion than 100 years as a sheep.” When asked why he would want to be identified with Mussolini he said he did not want that, but he wanted to be identified with good quotes—hmmm! The truth is he knew it would garner him media attention, which it did. If Trump wants to be identified with good quotes, how about picking some from Jefferson? Here is one I'd like for him to ponder: Summarized: "A wise government shall not take from the mouth of labor the bread it has earned." And I would have liked for him to ponder that when, Ahab like, who coveted the property of his neighbor Naboth, and had him killed in order to get it, Trump coveted the property of a neighbor and sought to use the power of the government to steal it from her. If there was ever an example of the "rich" buying influence in government to use it for his own personal gain it is TRUMP.

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ON ECONOMY:

TRUMP: Blah, blah blah — it's going to be great, it'll be great, "believe me" I know how bad these laws are because I have used them, I have abused them, and so I know how to fix them (YOU'VE GOT TO BE KIDDING ME!) Some of you like Trump because he takes advantage of laws favorable to his business, and even pushes the envelope on laws to serve his business interests, like eminent domain — and because he HAS USED AND ABUSED THE law to benefit his business, you think that qualifies him to be the best one to change them.

“Nobody else on this dais knows how to change it like I do, believe me.” Later he said, "I will. First of all, I think and I know the H1B very well. And it's something that I frankly use and I shouldn't be allowed to use it. We shouldn't have it. Very, very bad for workers. And second of all, I think it's very important to say, well, I'm a businessman and I have to do what I have to do..."

So, just like Clinton, when asked why he did some of the bad things he did, you remember what Clinton said, "Because I could." So here Trump admits to manipulating the laws to do things that he admits are "very, very bad for workers" but good for him — he admitted to doing things bad for workers, and here is his excuse: "I think it's very important to say, well, I'm a business man and I have to do what I have to do."

And you want to put this guy in the White House? You want this man have the powers of the Presidency? You are out of your ever lovin' mind, America. Wake up!

Trump supporters are not even listening to what he is saying, it's Obama all over again. I can't believe this is happening.

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So, I'm listening to this, and here is what I hear! Trump is telling me you know, I take advantage of laws to benefit my business, and I'll even manipulate the laws to serve my business interests — and that's why you can trust me! That's like, hey, I've robbed a lot of banks so you can trust me to protect your deposits. Right? I have stolen lots of cars, so you can trust me to park your, please, turn over the keys to me, believe me, I know all about stealing cars, trust me. I'm done. I have no respect at all for Trump supporters. Sorry! It's over. You've had the truth put in front of you about this guy, but you keep on supporting him—so, that's it. No one supporting Trump now, I mean anyone who claims to be a Christian conservative, like Phyllis Schlafly, deserves one bit of respect. I mean, guys like Carson—who stabbed his supporters in the back—I'm done with that kind of thing — that's exactly what we've been getting from the GOP that has us so furious — back stabbing compromisers — no one who has listened to and followed Carson can possibly follow him one step further — the guy is a Benedict Arnold—you totally wasted your support on that fellow and should make your disappointment known loud and clear. All Carson supporters should go to Cruz —

As for Trump? You can trust Trump to serve his own interests—he has bought politicians all his life to help him with his businesses, and now he is buying the Presidency to help his 120 international deals he is working on right now.

RUBIO: Fair trade is the only way to go.

CRUZ: shot at for TPP and fires back some important correction. I intended to do an entire show on TPP and TPA and TAA but I've got some more work to do on it before I'm ready to roll out an

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entire show on that subject. I might put it out as a special on my poscast site, we'll see. But I'm coming up on my time here—please don't think I'm ducking this — really? Okay, let's see. Okay, here, first, what do the initials refer to? TPP is the Trans Pacific Partnership and it's a trade treaty between the US and Pacific Rim countries. We'll look more closely at it, but for the present, understand that it's a bad deal for America. There may or may not be conspiratorial aspects to it—see, this is where it really requires some time to sort out — I think it feeds into the interests of globalists — but so do a great many other things conservatives are totally in favor of — remember that the bad guys use many of the same things for evil, that we use for good — I mean, TV is an example of that — so that does not mean everyone who participates in created TV shows is part of the conspiracy to use TV to advance the cause of evil — anyway, the point is that FREE TRADE is a good thing, but the problem is that TPP pretends to be about free trade but it does not actually promote free trade—

Now, Cruz was never in support of TPP.

Then there is TPA — Trade Promotion Authority — also called fast track. Most people are convinced TPA gives Obama the authority to make deals without Congress—in truth, it requires "that the treaty text will be submitted to Congress for an up-or-down vote with no amendments allowed." I think there is merit to this—can it be abused? EVERYTHING CAN BE ABUSED. But the bottom line is that Congress is not subordinating their role in treaties with TPA.

TAA — Trade adjustment assistance. This is an effort to address the problem of workers here who lose their jobs because of any

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trade treaty — and it is designed to make "trade treaties more tolerable to organized labor" — but anyway, maybe it will help to know that TPA is opposed by the liberal Dems, but supported by conservatives, including Cruz — and the conservatives oppose TPP and TAA—so, anyway, there is more to it all, and I want to get into the conspiratorial ring that has been built around all of this, but I'll have to do it later.

IMMIGRATION:

Trump, Kasich, Cruz and Rubio all recognize the need to address this but frankly, CRUZ IS THE ONLY ONE WHO HAS ARTICULATED A CLEAR AND WORKABLE PLAN TO FIX THIS PROBLEM.

EDUCATION:

CRUZ - the ONLY one talking about abolishing the Department of Education and sending education entirely back to the States. For all of Kasich's talk about sending it back to the States, he stops short of abolishing the Department of Education—in fact, it's something he has flip-flopped on.

CRUZ talks specifics - expand charter schools, home school and private schools, go to vouchers, and scholarships, and so on. He is the only one talking specifics.

And CARSON wants to run that department — and TRUMP will definitely keep it. Carson is a SELL OUT.

I've got to close —

VERY POWERFUL MOMENT when Cruz pointed out that in Trump rallies supporters are asked to raise their hand as a pledge to support him — if that does not give you the creeps, you don't know

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history — Heil Hitler! Cruz said the only hand raising he wants to is with his left hand on the Bible raising his right hand to pledge to the American people to preserve, protect and defend the constitution of the United States.

So, in conclusion—Luke 2:34-35, we'll be looking at this verse in my Easter sermons this year. Mary was told that the Christ child would be "for the fall and rising again of many in Israel; and for a sign which shall be spoken against ... that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

Look at the hearts being exposed in this primary; I've never seen anything like it. What surprises we have seen. For example, Palin endorses Trump (although not too surprising since Palin has had endorsement issues in the past) but Phyliss Schlafly endorses Trump? Huckabee endorses Trump? Carson endorses Trump? What is going on behind the scenes here—some "DEALING DONALD activity" buying these endorsements with favors — I mean, there is a sickness in the Christian community.

TRUMP's guy, what is he, a senior campaign manager, or something like that, manhandles a woman. I mean, he grabs her by the arm so tightly he bruises her, and nearly throws her to the ground being told, "no questions" — Trump says it's all made up, but this reporter for Brietbart is not going to let it go. I understand Brietbart has filed a lawsuit against Lewendowski —

Yeah, bruised her arm, nearly threw her to the floor. Trump asked about it and says it's all made up.
