1 Segment.01 Hello. I'm Dr. Jerry Scheidbach, pastor of the Lighthouse Baptist Church in
2 Santa Maria, CA—and your brain masseur—get ready for your brain massage.

3 What happened? Well, it's not the first time I've called a wave outside only to paddle out
4 to find a roller. The Dems took the House (barely) but were the Socialists shellacked as I
5 heard one pundit opine? What does this mid-term mean for Conservatives going
6 forward? It's disappointing, but not even close to devastating. Let's take a look.

7 The shooting in Thousand Oaks — 13 killed, one wounded and 15 others received
8 injuries trying to flee the scene. Suspect was a decorated Marine Vet. It's practically "made
9 to order" for the gun grabber crowd — one problem. Wait for it!

10 Crazy Anti-Abortion activist Rachelle Shannon served her 25 years in prison for shooting
11 and wounding George "baby killer" Tiller and a string of firebomb attacks on abortion
12 clinics back in 93 — abortion protectors are up in arms — isn't this an example of the
13 Brain Masseur getting it wrong again? I challenged anyone to show me a Christian
14 conservative who does this sort of evil and right away, the devil throws a decorated
15 Marine Vet and an Anti-abortion nut case at me — right? Wrong! Wait for it!

16 Sessions resigns, as he promised he would do after the midterm elections. Whittaker is
17 holding the helm until a permanent appointment is made. The left is frothing at the
18 mouth over the prospect that Trump will appoint an Attorney General that will General
19 that office and being Mueller under some accountability for his actions. That latest ploy
20 has been to float the rumor that Mueller is wrapping up his case, he is writing his final
21 brief on the matter — and it must be longer than War And Peace, or perhaps more like
22 Vanity Faire, because he has been writing this brief for about two months.

23 Well, that's almost certainly more than I can get in today — so, friends, let's get some
24 Heavenly perspective on all of this.

25 It's time for your Brain Massage.

26 [TRUTH]

27 I'm going to dedicate the entire second segment to my analysis on the midterm elections
28 and I assure you, it's worth a listen. For my Christian Conservative Corps members, if you

32 I must begin with the Thousand Oaks shooting at Borderline Bar and Grill — it was
33 College night — so the place was packed with College kids. 12 killed, one wounded and
34 15 others injured trying to avoid the bullets. The suspect was a decorated Marine Vet, 28.
35 Discharged honorably as a Corporal in 2013. Enrolled in college to study Sports — but
36 dropped out when a 19 year old athlete got on his case, talking down to him, and trying to

37 tell him how to do his job — decided that was not the career for him — got beat up in a
38 bar in 2015 — in April this year he was acting out angrily and erratically at home,
39 authorities were called in — Sheriff Dean said, "They called out our crisis intervention
40 team, our mental health specialists who met with him, talked to him, and cleared him."

41 So he was psyched and interviewed by the experts but was cleared.

42 I guess he decided to check out — and decided his last glorious act would be to take it out
43 on college kids in a bar. Hmmm!

44 His heart was full of evil, hatred, murder.

45 I read one article that says the shooter entered the bar and deployed smoke bombs before
46 he began shooting his Glock with a high capacity magazine — another says there was no
47 evidence found of any smoke bombs being used.

48 As I mentioned, this is practically "made to order" for the gun grabber crowd. But there is
49 one glaring and to the left a galling problem — this happened in California, the state that
50 already has the most strict gun control laws in the nation.

51 We have laws against high capacity magazines, and we have laws against concealed carry
52 without a permit, and we have laws against carrying an unpermitted weapon in public,
53 and we have laws against carrying a weapon in a bar, and we have laws — this guy broke
54 so many laws — and that's not supposed to happen.

55 If you pass a law, that's supposed to fix the problem. California was safe from this sort of
56 thing because we passed laws — but here is the thing. Laws are obeyed by law-abiding
57 citizens. Guys that want to take a gun into a bar and kill people are, well, these are not law
58 abiding, are they? In fact, it's reasonable to argue that California laws created the
59 environment for this sort of thing to happen — there was no one there to stop this man.
60 But a gun did finally stop this — when the guns arrived, this fellow soon saw it was time
61 to finish his check out and so he shot himself. These things, ironically, are always stopped
62 by guns.

63 A while back, I warned my fellow Californians that this was coming to our State — I
64 warned that gun laws do not stop gun violence. There are only two things that effectively
65 stop gun violence —the gospel and guns. If the shooter had surrendered to the gospel and
66 submitted to Christ as His Lord, he would not have committed the violent act — if the
67 Thousand Oaks Bar had armed protection on site, it's likely this would have been brought
68 to an earlier resolution.

69 The idea of outlawing high capacity magazines is not to eliminate the possibility anyone
70 would get shot in one of these violent attacks.

71 The idea is that it will reduce the shooters capacity to kill — if he is limited to a ten round
72 magazine, he has to reload after ten (or if there is one in the chamber, 11) shots giving the
73 innocent a chance to flee and the good guys an advantage to move in — so how is this
74 working for you?

75 These violent people can find a high capacity magazine and purchase and keep it illegally.
76 Right? That law does not work because people who want the high capacity magazine can
77 get them elsewhere and illegally. In fact all you do with such laws is create a black market
78 for them. Isn't that your argument about legalizing drugs — hey, my lib friends, is this not
79 your argument about the uselessness of drug laws? (I'll have to address that later, because
80 I believe drug control laws are appropriate but gun control laws are not — it's not a
81 contradiction, but I don't have time to go into that right now, except to say, while the law
82 does not eliminate the problem, it provides for action against those who violate the laws.
83 Why not have the same approach regarding guns? Because despite what that
84 *Constitutional scholar and logical genius* — NOT! Chris Matthews says, owning a gun is a
85 God given right. Becoming a public menace by drug abuse is not!) But, to get back to my
86 point...

87 If you want to reduce the capacity for violent people like this character, his name was Ian
88 David Long (they always have three names — by the way, the reason for this is that using
89 all three given names reduces the identification of others of a similar name with the
90 perpetrator — there are many Oswalds but fewer Lee Oswalds, and yet there are still far
91 more Lee Oswalds than there are Lee Harvey Oswalds.) Anyway, if you want to reduce
92 the capacity for violent men like Ian David Long to kill, PUT ARMED GUARDS
93 TRAINED IN DEFENSE in such public places — like Synagogues (October 27 — 11
94 killed in Pittsburgh), Krogers (October 28 — 2 killed in Kentucky, stopped by man
95 carrying a permitted concealed weapon), Yoga studios (November 3, 6 shot and 2 killed
96 in Tallahassee), and now a bar (November 7, 12 killed, plus the shooter in Thousand
97 Oaks, CA). (Curious! The two states that have the most second amendment
98 UNFRIENDLY laws had the greatest number of deaths from these violent predatory
99 shooters — Pennsylvania and California. Kentucky and Florida had the least. Hmmm!

100 The evidence PROVES that when GUNS arrive in the hands of good guys, bad guys very
101 soon stop shooting others, and in most instances end up shooting themselves. So, reason
102 would compel us to think the best way to stop this is to plant good guys with guns on the
103 ready to defend the public from bad guys with guns.

104 But, of course, immediately the gun grabbers start howling their lament, pining for a
105 world in which there are no guns. If only there were no guns.

106 Think about it. Gun laws don't work because bad guys can always find a way to get a gun.
107 So local gun confiscation laws kick in, where you have police going door to door
108 collecting guns from citizens — a la Nazi Germany, Stalin's Russia, Pol Pot's Cambodia,
109 and, well, you get the idea. So all the guns are confiscated in one town, and so robbers
110 from other town where they find guns come into the gun free town knowing they have
111 easy prey — these guys always pick gun free places to do this sort of thing, or have you
112 not noticed that. Don't go all Fort Hood on me — the soldiers were required to have their
113 weapons in lock up — that shooter knew he would be the only guy with a gun in that
114 environment. These violent predators always go where they can be sure they are safe and
115 have the advantage.

116 So, gun laws don't work and gun confiscation won't work because there is always
117 somewhere someone with a gun — so, then you start wanting to confiscate all guns in the
118 State, then people from other states with guns come in, so you want to confiscate all guns
119 in the nation, so people from other nations with guns come in, and finally, we must go to
120 the ultimate solution and that will be the banning of all firearms world wide, so we need a
121 strong man to rise to take over the world and take into his power and control every gun in
122 the world, and beat them into plowshares, you know — and there is a prophecy about
123 this. A fellow will ride in on a white horse with a bow and no arrows and will use the
124 promise of PEACE Peace to deceive many, and he will convince people to follow him and
125 he will take over political power in the earth, and all the forces of arms will be committed
126 to HIM and THEN — once he has the SWORD given to HIS POWER he will go on a
127 rampage that will destroy 1/4 of the population of this planet —

128 Gun control leads to local gun confiscation leads to state confiscation leads to national
129 confiscation leads to world confiscation leads to the ANTICHRIST — perfect!

130 Okay, got a bit long here gotta close the first segment.

131 So much to say, so little time.

132 Chris Matthews says there ought to be a law against saying "thoughts and prayers" to
133 people who are victims or family of victims of violent crimes. These liberals are off the
134 rails with their passion to control what everyone does and what everyone says.

135 He says it ought to be against THE LAW — to say THOUGHTS and PRAYERS. He
136 allows that in some cases this is well meant, but his guest objected and argued that it's
137 insincere and a cop out and that ACTION must be taken against people who own guns.

138 I've addressed the *thoughts and prayers* sentiment in a prior show.

139 Why does this annoy liberals?

140 Are they thoughtless and prayerless? (hahaha) Now, that was a Bob Ross happy accident
141 — okay. Liberals are annoyed by *thoughts and prayers* because they prefer an
142 environment where thoughtlessness and prayerlessness prevails — only a thoughtless and
143 prayerless society could ever be duped into accepting the liberal agenda. And that, my
144 friends, takes us to segment two — hold on through the break. I'll be right back.

145 Segment.02 Hello. Welcome back! I'm Dr. Jerry Scheidbach, pastor at the Lighthouse,
146 your brain masseur, and Paul Revere's lantern lighter, lighting the lamps in the church
147 belfry arch, signaling the enemy is on the march, an enemy that would steal from us our
148 liberty.

149 Midterms happened, and I did not get everything I wanted — I truly hoped for and
150 prayed for a red wave to rip up the diseased trees and carry their poisonous fruit out into
151 the sea — those are metaphors you can't appreciate fully unless you have been following
152 my Issachar Reports for some time — by the way, I begin each Sunday night service at 6
153 pm with a short Issachar Report and a call to prayer for our nation. This part of the
154 service is done by 6:30 - and all are invited.

155 I did not get everything I prayed for — and I address that issue in my special Issachar
156 Report message preached the night after the election, Wednesday night, titled What Does
157 It All Mean? You can find the audio of that message at our website —

159 Sermons&Studies — and then to Issachar Report and click. Also, you can find me on
160 Twitter and Facebook. Some of you might not know that the Brain Massage show is
161 posted to our Facebook page and our Twitter page — at least until a more honest
162 resource becomes available, someone that is not biased against Christian Conservatives
163 and is not constantly attempting to push the homosexual agenda and censor pro-life and
164 pro marriage messages — so — go to Facebook and search my name, Scheidbach, or
165 Brain Masseur, or Brain Massage! Likewise on Twitter. You can have the show

167 Let's look at what happened. First, it's not the first time I've called a wave outside only to
168 paddle out to find a roller. The Dems took the House (barely—they picked up 25 seats
169 more than the Republicans and there are no Independents). I heard one pundit say the
170 Socialists in the Democratic Party were shellacked; but two Democratic Socialists won
171 their races — Ocacio and Bernie. And they won handily — Ocacio is tracking at about
172 78% of the vote in her district and Bernie is bouncing at around 67%. Of course, with
173 grandpa Bernie we are talking Vermont, and Ocacio ran in the uber-liberal 14th district
174 of New York — it's like, you know, the liberal side of New York if you get my meaning.

175 These aspire to be the Ubermenschen — Nietzsche's superman of the future who will rise
176 above "conventional Christian morality" to "impose his own values" as described by
177 Nietsche in Thus Spake Zarathustra — in Bernie and Crazy Ocacio the far left, radical libs
178 see their Ubermenschen — and it sounds eerily like Heil Hitler.

179 Remember, the prophesied Beast rises behind the cloak of "peace, peace," and
180 disarmament and promises to scatter his spoils to the people — yep! All of this is plainly
181 prophesied in the Bible—I will begin introducing my study on Daniel this coming Sunday
182 morning. See you in church. Wait, I'm not done with the show. Hold on.

183 What does this mid-term mean for Conservatives going forward?

184 It's disappointing that we lost the House, but it's not even close to devastating. Let's take a
185 look.

186 First, when the Republicans took control of the House after Obama was elected, it was a
187 devastating blow to the Dems — they lost 60 house seats. They hung on in the Senate, but
188 barely, Republicans had 51 and the Dems 49. But in the House they were pulverized.

189 Before the election, it was GOP - 238 and DNC - 193. Now it's DNC - 218 and GOP - 197.
190 (There are thirteen House seats and two Senate seats still undecided. Republicans have a
191 fair shot at picking up another seat advantage in the Senate, and narrowing the Dem
192 victory in the house by a few more seats — but, we'll see.) When we compare this to what
193 happened to Obama in 2010, when the Republicans picked up 60 seats in the House and 6
194 Senate seats — the "red wave" Pelosi said might be a Tsunami if the Democrats come out

195 to vote turned into one of those waves that just start foaming along the top ridge then
196 peter out. Okay, I know, my red wave did not materialize either — so, let's look at this.

197 Most Midterms are not friendly to the party holding the Whitehouse — it's one of those
198 weird phenomena that no one has, to my mind, satisfactorily explained — but it does
199 seem to be consistently true.

200 The Democrats lost more seats in the Senate — so the GOP's hold on the Senate is even
201 stronger than it was — so as it stands, it look like the GOP has 54 seats and the DEMS
202 have 46.

203 Trump offered an insightful analysis of this so I won't repeat what he has already pointed
204 out — but it is huge for a President's party to GAIN seats in the Senate in his midterm,
205 while it is virtually understood that his party will lose seats in the House.

206 Also consider the fact that something like 43 Republicans resigned their seats in this mid-
207 term. They bowed out. Some of them simply wanted to move on to other work, which is
208 good. More should do that more regularly. However, to pick this time to do it — not
209 good!

210 Also, we know that many of these were RINOS who were never Trumpers —

211 So, another way to look at this would be to say this election purged a lot of never
212 Trumpers from the GOP party — and that can be a GOOD thing coming in to 2020. For
213 example, Mr. Jeff the Flake has declared he will do everything he can to hinder Trump's
214 effort to get in control of the renegade rogue prosecutor Mueller.

215 I won't have time to jump into that, as I would like. But let me say that Mueller needs
216 someone to rein him in. He has gone rogue and has become a persecutor in chief against
217 the Commander in Chief — it's embarrassing and it needs to be brought under someone's
218 supervision that will provide an HONEST assessment of what Mueller has done, and
219 ACT ON ALL THE EVIDENCE THAT HAS BEEN REVEALED ABOUT HILLARY
220 AND OBAMA AND THEIR OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE AND INTERFERNECE IN
221 OUR ELECTIONS.

222 Trump needs to put his foot down. Glad Sessions is out.

223 So, the conservative Republicans have actually increased in their strength in the Congress
224 — The Dems have nothing like a supermajority, and are more weak as a Majority party
225 than the Republicans were when they held it. So if the Republicans are willing to use the
226 filibuster they can hinder the Dems from doing too much damage between now and 2020.
227 But, so far as getting any help from Congress to further the President's agenda, that's
228 going to be a whole lot harder.

229 With regard to impeachment, the Dems have the majority, and in the mind of many,
230 their mandate is to impeach Trump (although, some dems believe they lost because they
231 made too much noise about impeaching the President — so, we'll see! I'm already reading
232 calls coming for impeachment from the next Congress.) I think most of us expect the
233 Dems to begin impeachment proceedings almost immediately upon the installation of the

234 116th Congress. (By they way, nothing has changed yet — right now the GOP still has
235 both houses.)

236 So, all the Congress needs is a simple majority to approve each separate article of
237 impeachment. Then it goes to the Senate. In the Senate, a 3/4 vote is required to actually
238 impeach, or to approve the articles of impeachment, and to declare a judgment on the
239 case. That seems highly unlikely given the make up of the Senate at present.

240 I need to hurry — the disturbing take away from this election is the rise of the Democratic
241 Socialists in the Democrat party — Ocacio and Bernie won. While it's true, they won in
242 uberville — the Democratic Socialists have got a pretty firm foothold in the Democratic
243 Party. This can also turn to our advantage however, since it reveals what we've known
244 about the Democratic Party for a long time and that is they are closet Socialists.

245 Another disturbing take away is the amount of hyper liberal millionaires that poured
246 millions into this election in order to buy the House and Senate. They almost took out
247 Ted Cruz — I think Trump saved his seat for him, and I'm glad of it. But Bloomberg and
248 Soros poured millions — I think it was something to the tune of 150 million dollars was
249 poured into this election from the deep pocket uberliberals. How "money" buys votes is
250 another topic, for another time, but sadly, there are a lot of people in America today who
251 are so lazy, they do not do due diligence before they vote.

252 Proposition 6 in California is an example. Ask anyone you know if they want to pay the
253 gas tax — and you'll get confused answers. The wicked California politician who
254 controlled how that proposition was worded, and the lying obfuscation on the left about
255 that proposition is shameful. But many people were confused by how the proposition was
256 worded and did not understand that YES meant repeal the gas tax.

257 So, the point is, a lot of voters do not take the time to listen carefully, to get educated on
258 what's on the ballot, and to vote with intelligence —

259 They are susceptible to the influence of propoganda and can be swayed by great swelling
260 words of men's spin and outright lies.

261 Take into consideration the media bias flooding these people with their spin and their
262 lies, and their fake news, and add to all of this the influence of voter fraud — like what is
263 going on in Broward County, Florida — AGAIN. Yeah. When will something be done
264 about that nonsense in Broward County?

265 Many of these races really are close enough so that voter fraud can tip the scale.

266 Alright, I need to close — final assessment: It could have been much worse. We have the
267 Senate, and that really is the more important victory since the Senate will ultimately
268 decide any impeachment question, and the Senate confirms Justice appointments, and
269 treaties, and so forth.

270 43 Republican resignations increased the GOPs vulnerability significantly, I over
271 estimated the size of the "soft center" of the Democratic Party — the Democratic Party is
272 much sicker than I imagined. This election gives us a reality check opportunity —

273 California is in far greater trouble than we thought, and the Democratic Party as a whole
274 is far more sick than I thought.

275 Here is a taste. When Newsome won, he vowed to show the country what progressive
276 governance looks like." Are you kidding me. Bankrupt state, least desirable State to live in,
277 our kids education second to LAST when it used to be second to none. And Brown has
278 taken us DOWN the progressive governance path to where we are today — and now
279 Gavin says, look out, he is determined to be Brown on steroids.

280 My message Wednesday night will help you if you need some heavenly perspective on
281 how God's people should respond to this.

282 But you probably noticed, not one Republican went into the streets to protest or burn
283 buildings or riot or get into anyone's face to scream at them, or throw a coke into a
284 liberal's face — because, that is not how we roll.

285 But we do roll, and we will keep on rolling.

286 I'm outta time —

287 I have lit the lamps in the Church belfry arch and now you let me know if you see them.
288 It's LIGHTS ON if you see the LIGHTS ARE ON and you will ride like Revere and spread
289 the warning, (essentially, it means you agree with what I'm saying) or you say LIGHTS
290 OFF -- which means you reject what I'm saying and disagree strongly with me. So, what
291 will it be today, lights on, or lights off?
