1 Segment.01 Hello. The Doctor is in—pastor of the Lighthouse  
2 Baptist Church in Santa Maria, CA—and your brain masseur—get  
3 ready for your brain massage.

4 The Dems are working the Rs — Russia, Race, Recession — I think  
5 I heard Hannity point that out. They tried to get Trump on the  
6 Russia hoax — and they are literally praying for a recession. No  
7 kidding — but there is one thing they keep coming back to and  
8 that's the RACE card — they pound on that 24/7 — Trump's a  
9 racist, Trump's a racist — ad nauseum.

10 Many fear a recession will dump Trump. Our national debt is  
11 climbing into the Trillion-dollar orbit — and I'll do a show on that  
12 in a few weeks. But I've never believed we should vote our pocket  
13 book. I think we should vote our conscience and TRUST GOD, not  
14 government, with our economy. But what about the fourth R.

15 The fourth R is righteousness — or, doing what is RIGHT! The left  
16 has treated Trump deplorably — what they have been doing in this  
17 country is WRONG and it's been WRONG for a very long time. I  
18 mean, it's just WRONG that the DEMS keep accusing Republicans  
19 of racism when it's the Republicans that stopped slavery and  
20 supported King's call for civil rights. It's just WRONG, what  
21 Democrats have done to San Francisco, Los Angeles, Chicago, you  
22 name it! It's just WRONG, and it must STOP!

23 It's just WRONG that the DEMS have behaved with such vicious  
24 hatred, even assaulting conservatives physically — it's just  
25 WRONG they way they've been behaving and it would be simply  
26 WRONG to reward them for this behavior. The RIGHT thing to  
27 do is vote against the Democrats. It's as simple as that.

28 Now, as you know, I'm writing a new book, titled GOD'S WAR:  
29 Why Christians Should Rule the World: The case supporting  
30 Christians involvement in every sphere of life, including politics. It  
31 comes down to a powerful biblical argument for voting Republican  
32 in this coming election. More to the point, it presents the case for  
33 why CHRISTIANS of all people MUST vote in 2020, and they must  
34 vote against the godless Democrat Party.

35 The deadline for completing this book and getting it to the printers  
36 is hard on me, so, I decided to put together a sort of encore.

37 Okay! The left claims that at the core of their hatred for Trump is  
38 their belief that he is racist. Hate racism; hate Trump, that's it. In  
39 this show I intend to explore that charge thoroughly, and, of  
40 course, honestly.

41 I'm going to explain what racism is. And you will see that the  
42 Democratic Party is RACIST — not the Republicans.

43 What, exactly, is *racism*?

44 My friends — it's time for your Brain Massage®

45 [TRUTH]

46 Where did this word *racist* come from? Some claim Trotsky<sup>1</sup>  
47 coined the term in the 30s.

48 But Darwin used the word before Trotsky. "The civilized races of  
49 man will almost certainly exterminate and replace the savage races  
50 through the world."<sup>2</sup> The original title of Darwin's infamous book  
51 was *On The Origin of Species by Means of Natural Selection, or the*  
52 *Preservation of Favoured Races in the Struggle for Life*. Darwin  
53 abhorred slavery — but he believed that as far as evolution was

54 concerned, the blacks were inferior and the whites would  
55 ultimately displace them.

56 Darwin, therefore, was a practical *racist*.

57 I've heard a black racist claim all Western Civilization, all its  
58 institutions and culture, religious and otherwise, is based on  
59 racism. Of course, that person believes conservative white people  
60 are the cause of this. How strange! The guy is right, though.

61 All Western Civilization, yea, all scientific communities around the  
62 world build their scientific theory on the teachings of a racist  
63 named Charles Darwin — a man who believed the "white race" was  
64 superior to all others. And so, by extension, all touched by Darwin,  
65 or shaped by his beliefs are *racist*, right? Hmmmm.

66 But conservative Christians never subscribed to this theory of  
67 Darwin's — and Republicans have fought long and hard against  
68 these ideas.

69 But Darwin did not invent the word either.

70 The root of the word *race* runs into the Latin word *razza*. It means  
71 breed, or lineage. In 1854 the word *racial* appeared and it was used  
72 to describe differences in groups of people identified by common  
73 physical traits.

74 The first people to be accused of *racial prejudice* were Californians.  
75 In 1874, the *Philadelphia Inquirer* published an article that claimed  
76 Californians were guilty of *racial prejudices*.<sup>3</sup>

77 By the time we get to Hitler — the word had come to maturity in  
78 its meaning. Here is where Trotsky comes into the picture. He did  
79 not invent the term, but he did see the truth about *racism*. He

80 called it a *vapid and bombastic variety* of assumed superiority  
81 based on physical attributes that identify you with a certain group.

82 Like, "Black Supremacy," or "White Supremacy," or — you get the  
83 idea.

84 So the word evolved (hehe—thank you Darwin) from *race* to *racial*  
85 to *racism* (and by this time it referred to the pretense that one race  
86 is superior to another) to *racist*, someone that subscribes to racism.

87 A *racist* identified someone with an extreme sense of superiority  
88 over other races/nations.

89 The bottom line is that by the time we get to Hitler, *racist* was  
90 identified with a belief in racial superiority connected with an  
91 aggressive mission to dominate, or subjugate, inferior ones.

92 This is the belief that Democrats used to justify slavery. This is  
93 what, in the minds of the Jihadis, justified 9-11, and every other  
94 terrorist act.

95 A racist is someone who believes he is superior to others based on  
96 racial characteristics. Depending on their sentiments, some racists  
97 see themselves as purging the earth of inferiors — survival of the  
98 fittest sort of thing, while other racists see themselves as gracious  
99 superiors reaching down to the pitiful inferiors to feed them, like  
100 they were their pets.

101 Well, I'm here to tell you that this white man respects the dignity of  
102 every man, and, when I heard Martin Luther King say he dreamed  
103 of a day a man would be judged by the content of his character and  
104 not by the color of his skin — I mean, that just sunk in deep into  
105 my soul!

106 The righteousness of that statement settled down into my heart  
107 and became part of the foundation of my thinking.

108 The Republican Party was founded on the principal, that a man's  
109 character defines him, not his skin color.

110 Okay, we hammered out a clear definition, a real definition of  
111 *racist*. The way liberals use it today it's anyone who disagrees with  
112 their politics. The rationale is that their politics are nice and help  
113 the pitiful people who cannot help themselves, and so anyone  
114 opposed to them is mean and does not want pitiful people to be  
115 helped — and so they brand them *racist*.

116 But the racism is in their attitude toward those they view as  
117 inferiors that need their protection and provision. Most of the  
118 people who oppose their politics do so because of the great damage  
119 their policies bring upon those they say they are trying to help.

120 We look at each person as an individual and expect them to take  
121 responsibility for themselves and their families. In this country  
122 there is always a place for someone willing to get the training they  
123 need to be useful and then work hard. We don't view people as pets  
124 that we, as a nation, are obliged to "keep." We believe in the dignity  
125 of every man woman and child created in the image and likeness of  
126 God — and we believe that includes every man woman and child  
127 on this planet.

128 The racists in America today are those who think in terms of skin  
129 color — who are constantly talking about race — and who use the  
130 charge of *racist* against people who don't even think in terms of  
131 race.

132 Okay, let's look at the charge that Trump is racist.

133 I have put together an audio CD that combined all the show  
134 segments where I addressed what the New York Times called  
135 "Donald Trump's Racism: the Definitive List." It's an article  
136 published in the New York Times written by David Leonhardt and  
137 Ian Prasad Philbrick, Jan. 15, 2018.<sup>4</sup>

138 Here, I'll simply run through them. But you can call and I'll send  
139 you my Definitive Argument that Trump is NOT racist for a \$20  
140 gift to the radio show. Okay, hold on through the break; I'll be right  
141 back with rebuttal to the liberal's argument that Trump is a racist.

142 Segment.02 Hello. Welcome back! I'm Dr. Jerry Scheidbach, pastor  
143 at the Lighthouse, your brain masseur, and Paul Revere's lantern  
144 lighter, lighting the lamps in the church belfry arch, signaling the  
145 enemy is on the march, an enemy that would steal from us our  
146 liberty.

147 1. Trump was accused of discrimination in his rental policies in  
148 New York in 1970. This charge gets little notice outside of  
149 *ubermenschen*-liberal circles (you did not know *uber* comes from  
150 German *ubermenschen* which refers to the superior man of the  
151 future who would rise above conventional Christian morality to  
152 create and impose his own values on all others?).  
153 Why does this charge get little notice outside liberal circles?  
154 Because he was never convicted! He denied the charges, never even  
155 paid a fine.

156 2. "Trump treated black employees at his casinos differently from  
157 whites, according to multiple sources." All hearsay. All we have is  
158 the word of some disgruntled employee and Trump's denial. We  
159 don't have a situation where we have witnesses to corroborate any  
160 of these stories.

161 3. Trump took out an ad in New York newspapers "urging the  
162 death penalty for five black and Latino teenagers accused of raping  
163 a white woman in Central Park." If you read the ad, as I have, you  
164 will see that there is not a racist statement anywhere in it. The only  
165 racists here are the people that read this and see only the words  
166 black, and Latino but fail to see the word rape. By the way, Trump  
167 does not refer to their race in his ad.

168 4. "An obsession with Dark-Skinned Immigrants." Really? They  
169 allege Trump was "Disparaging immigrants as criminals and

170 rapists." That it is a FLAT OUT LIE. It's a wicked, and evil thing to  
171 lie against a man's character in the way Liberals do.

172 Trump was talking about those who illegally cross our borders, A.  
173 and then B. specifically he was talking about MS—13 gang  
174 members.

175 5. Trump called for a complete shutdown of Muslims entering the  
176 United States, including Muslim-American citizens who were  
177 outside the country at the time. That's racist?

178 Was FDR racist when he ordered the internment of Japanese  
179 American citizens during WWII?

180 6. "Trump said a federal judge hearing a case about Trump  
181 University was biased because of the judge's Mexican heritage."  
182 After the Judge in question ruled against Trump, he told the Wall  
183 Street Journal that he thought the judge had a conflict of interest.  
184 Trump was concerned the Judge's Mexican lineage and affinities  
185 (not to mention he was an Obama appointed judge) influenced his  
186 decision. Racist democrats do this all the time — if the police  
187 officer is white and he stops a black for questioning, the officer is  
188 racist. If the officer is black and stops a black for questioning, the  
189 black officer is an Uncle Tom racist. You can't win with these  
190 people. So we'd better win in 2020.

191 7. "In June 2017, Trump said 15,000 recent immigrants from Haiti  
192 'all have AIDS' and that 40,000 Nigerians, once seeing the United  
193 State, would never 'go back to their huts' in Africa."<sup>5</sup> Trump  
194 stormed into his office waving a paper that reported 2,500  
195 immigrants from Afghanistan had received visas — he said, "that's  
196 a terrorist haven." He told them they were making him look  
197 foolish, and like he did not take his promises to the American  
198 people seriously. He was unhappy, okay? He spoke of the 15,000  
199 from Haiti, then, according to this report, he grumbled, "they all

200 have AIDS." When liberals make blatant racist statements, they get  
201 a pass from msm. When a conservative uses hyperbole to make a  
202 point in frustration — it's proof he is a racist.

203 Liberals make outlandish remarks about Christians routinely —  
204 which is a kind of racism, you know, when you really think about  
205 how liberals use that word today — at the very least it is bigotry —  
206 and yet they consistently get a pass. And that's because the  
207 antichrist media believes it.

208 Besides, what Trump was saying was grounded in truth. Haiti is  
209 rife with sexually transmitted diseases — and many people from  
210 Nigeria live in what we would call huts.

211 8. "At the White House on Jan. 11, Trump vulgarly called for less  
212 immigration from Haiti and Africa and more from Norway." How  
213 is that racist? Unless liberals are admitting their own racism.  
214 Remember when Blacks complained that whites dominated TV  
215 and Movies and felt underrepresented — that it made America  
216 look all white, and suggested blacks did not exist?

217 I agreed with that, by the way. Well, it's not hard imagine some  
218 watch the massive influx of illegal immigrants and become  
219 concerned about the impact it's having on our culture —  
220 particularly when we find ourselves losing our language, even our  
221 political values and beliefs are being disrespected — add to this that  
222 some of these same folks are seen burning our flag in our streets —  
223 refusing to stand for the national anthem — it's getting wearying  
224 so, once again, on a visceral level, Trump channels American angst  
225 — but it is not racist to ask why don't we have more immigrants  
226 that "look like us"? Isn't that what the black community was saying  
227 back in the 60s, why don't we see more people on TV that look like  
228 us? I don't think that was a racist thing, coming from the Blacks,  
229 and I don't think it should be assumed to be racist when a white  
230 man asks a similar question.



231 9. Trump "spent years suggesting that the nation's first black  
232 president was born not in the United States but in Kenya." I have a  
233 facsimile of Obama's alleged Hawaii Birth Certificate, and I have  
234 recently been provided a copy of an Hawaiian original — who  
235 showed me an authentic copy of his Certificate — thank you  
236 Mitch! There is simply no doubt about it. Obama's is fake. Why  
237 else would he spend hundreds of thousands of dollars trotting out  
238 his lawyers all over the country trying to quash efforts to compel  
239 him to produce his certificate, and why else would the first one's  
240 put out there be fake — proved to be fake.

241 But, the bottom line is — what's racist about this? I can't express a  
242 negative personal opinion about Obama without being called a  
243 racist?

244 10. "Trump called Obama (who was editor in chief of the Harvard  
245 Law Review) 'a terrible student, terrible.'" Again, how does that  
246 make someone racist? This should disturb every freedom, free  
247 speech, and freedom of thought loving American very deeply.  
248 Don't you see it? Why would they assume the remark was about  
249 Obama's skin color unless they assume if you say someone is a  
250 terrible student you must be thinking about his skin color? Whose  
251 the racist here?

252 11. "Although he has repeatedly denied using racist language,  
253 Trump has repeatedly called Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D—Mass.),  
254 'Pocahontas.'" That's what they call racism? This guy probably also  
255 believes the Tomahawk Chop used by football fans was racist —  
256 there is nothing racist about such statements.

257 12. "Trump frequently claimed that Obama did not work hard as  
258 president." Well, that's my opinion, too. So does that make me a  
259 racist? Really? The only motivation anyone could have for such an  
260 opinion about Obama would be because he is black? Uh, who is the  
261 racist here?

262 13. "Trump falsely claimed that President Obama 'issued a  
263 statement for Kwanzaa but failed to issue one for Christmas.'" How  
264 does this prove Trump is racist? Kwanzaa is all about race — it's  
265 entirely, and absolutely about hating the white man. Merry  
266 Christmas is about the Saviour sent to save all mankind, without  
267 regard to race. Besides, the fact is Obama made a formal Happy  
268 Kwanzaa statement from the White House and did not make a  
269 formal, from the White House Merry Christmas statement.

270 Obama regularly went out of his way to identify with those who for  
271 one reason or another hated America.

272 14. Trump "often casts heavily black American cities as dystopian  
273 war zones." Uh — are you even aware of a city called Chicago, or  
274 Los Angeles? Have you ever heard of Watts or Compton? But the  
275 point here is, once again, with the liberals, you can't say the  
276 TRUTH. They have blocked the TRUTH from getting into these  
277 conversations by immediately crying RACIST when somebody  
278 simply observes a FACT. But that should not surprise us since  
279 Biden explained Democrats believe in TRUTH not FACTS.  
280 Divorce facts from truth and you have neither. When Trump said,  
281 "Our inner cities, African Americans, Hispanics, are living in hell  
282 because it's so dangerous. You walk down the street, you get shot"  
283 — that is NOT A RACIST STATEMENT — it is the OPPOSITE of  
284 RACISM.

285 The liberals might have decided, well, that's just the way those  
286 people are — and to talk about it is to be racist — BUT WE SAY,  
287 NO, I DON'T ACCEPT THAT. I EXPECT BETTER OF MY  
288 FELLOW HUMAN BEINGS, I EXPECT BETTER OF THEM  
289 AND FOR THEM.

290 The liberals are the ones who view these problems as related  
291 somehow to race.

292 15. Trump "frequently offers false crime statistics to exaggerate  
293 urban crime, including about Oakland, Philadelphia and Ferguson,  
294 Mo." So, Trump purposely gets statistics wrong when discussing  
295 these things? What I found interesting here is that the writers  
296 Leonhardt and Philbrick did not offer any specific statistics as an  
297 example. Want to know why? Easy! If they did, they would be  
298 called out for their hypocrisy.

299 Every statistic Trump cited has a source to support it. If a newer  
300 study adjusted the stats downward, why didn't they stipulate that  
301 and offer the correction — Listen, THE PEOPLE LIVING IN  
302 THOSE CITIES KNOW THEY LIVE IN A HELLSCAPE — they  
303 don't need statistics to know they are afraid to walk their streets at  
304 night, or fear for their children every time they send them off to  
305 school.

306 16. Trump is "quick to highlight crimes committed by dark-  
307 skinned people, sometimes exaggerating or lying about them" and  
308 they offer an example, "such as a claim about growing crime from  
309 'radical Islamic terror' in Britain." What a strange choice of  
310 example! At the time Trump made this comment, there was, in  
311 fact, an increasing amount of agitation in Britain coming from the  
312 "radical Islamic terror."

313 17. "He is slow to decry hate crimes committed by whites against  
314 dark-skinned people, but quick to point it out the other way  
315 around." But the fact is each time he addresses any crime, he points  
316 out the horror of the crime and not the color of those who  
317 committed it. Only a racist would assume if he is talking about an  
318 area where crime is out of control that he is thinking about race —  
319 he is thinking about CRIME — It's a culture problem not a color  
320 problem.

321 18. "He frequently criticizes prominent African-Americans for  
322 being unpatriotic, ungrateful and disrespectful."

323 Then they provide an example: "He called Puerto Ricans who  
324 criticized his administration's response to Hurricane Maria  
325 'politically motivated ingrates.'"<sup>6</sup>

326 Think about this! He sent massive relief to Puerto Rico to assist  
327 them in the effort to recover from Hurricane Maria. The MSM, of  
328 course, runs into the streets and baits the Puerto Ricans with  
329 questions, determined to find someone to criticize Trump!

330 So we hear Puerto Ricans dissing the President, or America — and  
331 Trump reacts to these reports and calls them politically motivated  
332 ingrates, which is what they are. It's refreshing! Because it's so  
333 honest.

334 Think it through. Only a racist would assume that calling someone  
335 a politically motivated ingrate had something to do with their race.

336 19. Trump "has retweeted white nationalists without apology." The  
337 article linked to this point actually begins by making a fair  
338 statement that Trump retweets stuff irresponsibly, and suggests he  
339 is ignorant about the connection these Tweets have to radical white  
340 supremacists or radical nationalists.

341 When they say he does this "without apology" — what does that  
342 mean? It is not enough for them that he has openly clarified what  
343 he means by nationalism and that he is opposed to any notion of  
344 white supremacy — but what they want is for him to say, oh, I  
345 Retweeted that one, and I really should not have done that? The  
346 point is, does he have sympathy with White Supremacy and he has  
347 openly declared that he does not.

348 20. "He called some of those who marched alongside white  
349 supremacists in Charlottesville, VA, last August "very fine people."

350 Did you notice they were careful not to say Trump said the white  
351 supremacists were "very fine people." No! And this is the trick of

352 these devils. But when Democrats heard it their mind registered  
353 the idea that Trump said White Supremacists were "very fine  
354 people." For example, Biden perpetrated the LIE that Trump  
355 referred to White Supremacists as "very fine people." It's a LIE!

356 You should really feel nothing but loathing for him, and all the  
357 others who do this routinely.

358 Trump has come out against "hatred, bigotry, and violence ..."  
359 repeatedly. Never reported.

360 21. "After David Duke, the former leader of the Ku Kux Klan,  
361 endorsed him, Trump was reluctant to disavow Duke even when  
362 asked directly on Television." Okay, I watched the clip. It's linked  
363 here.<sup>7</sup>

364 Trump said he would be glad to condemn any group he felt was  
365 deserving of it, please send him a list of the groups and he would  
366 have research done and then offer condemnation where warranted.  
367 He said he did not know David Duke or anything about the White  
368 Supremacist group.

369 Did you know that no one took Trump up on his offer? He said,  
370 send me a list, I'll research it, and get back to you.

371 And nothing is said about the Democrats that cozy up to  
372 Farrakhan, and make statements like Pol Pot is one of their favorite  
373 leaders, or praise Ho Chi Minh.

374 So, the question is when will the New York Times publish the  
375 definitive list proving Liberals are Dictator loving, mass murder  
376 loving Communists? Because that, my friend, is a whole lot nearer  
377 the truth that this tripe about Trump being racist.

378 22. "Trump hired Steve Bannon as his campaign head and later  
379 White House chief strategist. Under Bannon's leadership, the

380 website Breitbart made white nationalism a central theme. It  
381 featured a section, for example, on 'black crime.'"

382 If anyone should know something about extremists embedding  
383 themselves within your organization and creating problems for  
384 your party it would be, well, the DEMOCRATS, ya think? Ever  
385 hear about *the squad*?

386 HE FIRED BANNON, okaaaayy?

387 Finally, 23. "Trump endorsed and campaigned for Roy Moore.  
388 Trump's endorsement of Roy Moore would be problematic if you  
389 believe all the lies the media told about Roy Moore. Roy Moore is  
390 an honest Christian man who illustrates the point of my book,  
391 GOD'S WAR. The antichrist spirit goes into apoplexy when  
392 Christians begin moving into territory the children of  
393 disobedience, who hate Christ, and rage against His LORDSHIP  
394 are convinced belongs to them. But it doesn't. Get my book. Lord

396 I have lit the lamps in the Church belfry arch and now you let me
