Segment.01 Hello. I'm Dr. Scheidbach, pastor at the Lighthouse Baptist Church in Santa Maria, CA—and your brain masseur—get ready for your brain massage.

Let's keep Happy Thanksgiving happy!!!! — Trump did a great job putting a few chuckles in his Turkey pardon speech — in case you missed it; President Trump expressed his appreciation for how well the Turkeys, Bread, and Butter, had been trained by their owners to remain calm in any situation. And he explained that was good because he understood Bread and Butter were subpoenaed to appear in Schiff's basement — and that at least then Schiff would have testimony from someone that had actually met him. Now, I voted for Bread to get the pardon — but in the video I saw, Trump pardoned Butter — and yet Fox tells me he pardoned them both. You know, the pardoning both turkeys always troubled me — seemed a little too politically correct to me. But, — you see, we can keep the happy in Happy Thanksgiving — thank you, Mr. President, I admire your amazing ability to keep your chin up when so many are taking swipes at it —

Thanksgiving is probably my favorite holiday — I love them all. All our American traditions are great! And the left is attacking every one of them. on a whim, and *frek* which in the mid-1500s was used to describe one as eager, zealous, bold, brave, or fierce.

Its use to describe a capricious notion (the mid 1500s) to something unusual, a fancy (1784), morphed, in the 1800s, to be used for something "abnormally developed," either a person or a plant, or animal, or whatever — and the phrase freak of nature became popular for bearded ladies, albinos, and so on.

By the late 1800s, 1887, and on, it was used to identify someone obsessed with anything — a health freak, a study freak, — whatever stood out as unusual, strange, or bizarre came to be called *a freak* in the early 1900s.

As a verb, its root meaning is to "change, distort" — as a noun, it identifies someone considered "out there," someone that is abnormal in behavior or appearance.

It is rooted, interestingly, in a word used among the Scottish that, used positively, described a "bold man, a warrior" — and negatively, as one that is "greedy, eager, bold, or impudent."

Now, if you cannot see how perfectly this word may be used to describe transgender advocates and other gender-confused anti-Christ warriors — I can't give any more time to trying to help you. They are, by definition, freaks. (Now, a caveat is in order. There is undoubtedly some subjectivity in how we apply the epithet. As our culture degenerates from the standards and norms of our Founders, there follows a parallel degradation of our sense of morals. In another decade, we Christians may be called the freaks—oh, wait; that's already happening. Young Christian men and women are looked at and called *freaks* because they desire to save themselves for their life partner — and refuse to join in the sexual promiscuity that has given us the disturbing statistic: 3 million young people contracting a sexually transmitted disease yearly. BUT WE DON'T CARE ABOUT OUR CHILDREN! LET THEM DESTROY THEIR FUTURES AND THEIR LIVES! ANY HOPE THEY MIGHT HAVE FOR A HEALTHY AND HAPPY MARRIAGE IS OF NO CONCERN TO US, RIGHT? LET'S ENCOURAGE THEM TO LIVE LIKE RATS AND CRAWL ALL OVER EACH OTHER! — But, I must say that according to nature and nature's GOD, these people are freaks against nature.

But, there are many laboring to "mainstream" the unnatural tendency among about, what is it, 1 to 3% of the population who reject their God-given gender and insanely imagine they can change it by simply declaring themselves to be whatever gender they desire to be. - 84 The Antichrist-ragers are attacking every holy day in America that is related in any real
- 85 way to CHRIST and Christianity. Halloween, that's okay but Christ-mas (means
- 86 CHRIST was SENT), or EASTER (from a German cognate, oester which means
- 87 resurrection), or THANKSGIVING in all things give thanks.
- 88 Of course, as many of you know, Christmas and Easter are attacked from both sides.
- Anyway, the attack on Thanksgiving has developed into an open assault. We live at a critical time in the history of our country.
- 91 We will decide to pull this erstwhile God-fearing country out from under God entirely,
- and so provoke God to drop the U.S. into the maw of hell to be swallowed while Satan
- burps and picks the Christians from his teeth. Or we will rise against the antichrist-ragers
- and assert the RIGHTEOUSNESS OF CHRIST and HIS CLAIM of LORDSHIP over ALL
- 95 Heaven and Earth and reaffirm America as ONE NATION UNDER GOD, INDIVISIBLE
- 96 with LIBERTY AND JUSTICE FOR ALL that's right! For ALL.
- We have acknowledged the right of crazy men to think they are women, but we refuse to
- yield our right to recognize them for what they are confused men.
- 99 Get this! We have gone so far as to acknowledge your right not to have your children
- exposed to Christian indoctrination in the public school because we all believe in freedom
- of thought and belief, right?
- My right to believe in God and worship Christ Jesus does not mean I have a right to make
- 103 you believe and worship right?
- 104 So what makes you think your right to believe you are a girl when biologically you are a
- male of the species, gives you the right to force me to believe it or affirm it? You don't feel
- 106 any obligation to AFFIRM MY BELIEF IN CREATION why should I affirm your
- belief in, say, evolution?
- 108 Why can you teach my children evolution and gender confusion and distort American
- history and tell my children what I believe are LIES about America and about his family's
- faith what logic is this? You can teach your religion to my kids, but I can't teach my
- 111 religion to yours.
- 112 I AM DONE WITH THIS NONSENSE. You have fooled Christians long enough. We will
- wake up and rise and put a stop to this nonsense.
- You don't get to teach your values to my child. You have no obligation to affirm my
- beliefs and I have NO OBLIGATION TO AFFIRM YOURS.
- You might think I've strayed from the point, but indeed I have not. Public education has
- become Marxist indoctrination in America. They want to teach America out of our

- children and this is partly done by attacking all our Christian cultural holidays and they are attacking Thanksgiving.
- Okay, it's time to take a short break. Look, I believe all men must repent and believe on
- Jesus Christ and confess Jesus is LORD but that does not give me the right to force
- 122 you to confess Jesus is LORD right? What if I pass a law that says you must AFFIRM
- 123 MY FAITH and AGREE WITH ME and USE THE LANGUAGE that makes me

- 129 I say YOU DON'T HAVE THAT RIGHT!
- 130 I say close down the public schools, turn them over to private schools. Whatever funds
- are collected by taxation to fund education goes with the child to whatever school their
- parents choose for their children. You can start your own I HATE GOD school, but you
- need to stop trying to force you wicked ideology on my family. If you want a school where
- coaches don't pray for their students, then go to your ANTICHRIST-RAGER High
- School and I'll send my kids to CHRIST IS KING High School then you'll be happy,
- and I'll be happy and we can all have a Happy Thanksgiving your school can teach
- your kids all the lies you guys have invented against the Pilgrims, and we will teach our
- 138 kids the TRUTH and we'll see what fruit comes from your school because I've noticed,

- use often, but I think I failed to include it in my list of resources last week I'm grateful
- to faithful listeners Tom and Nancy who brought this to my attention.

- 158 Chuck Norris was addressing an upcoming article in Time magazine (Dec. 2-9 issue) that 159 is titled, "The Way American Kids Are Learning About the 'First Thanksgiving' Is
- 160 Changing."1 (You can read it here online. Google Time.com, search for Thanksgiving
- 161 history. I've read the article and Norris' response. I think I'll follow the Norris article and
- 162 interject my comments along the way.
- 163 I remember tracing my hand on a paper plate and then gluing on the feathers and dotting
- 164 the thump with eyes, and coloring in the Turkey — and the teacher having paper
- 165 headbands with feathers for some of us and paper headbands with the picture of a Pilgrim
- 166 hat glued to the front for others of us, and orchestrating a mock-up of the first
- 167 thanksgiving there at Plymouth Rock.
- 168 Norris laments that has been replaced with "teachers who instruct the kids that Pilgrims
- 169 and Puritans were invaders who destroyed the land and annihilated the indigenous
- 170 civilization."
- 171 According to the Time article, teachers gathered on November 9 at a workshop in
- 172 Washington, D.C., titled "Rethinking Thanksgiving in Your Classroom."
- 173 In this conference, the teachers were told that the Pilgrims were not enjoying a peaceful
- 174 celebration of their first successful harvest with the Indians. Instead, really, they were
- 175 celebrating the burning of a Pequot village and the killing of the son of an Indian chief. Of
- 176 course, most of the teachers were stunned at the "revelation." One said she came from the
- 177 conference realizing she had been teaching her children a lot of misperceptions. Really?
- 178 That's all it took to sway her — wow, what a freak! Hah! Now, class, you must remember
- 179 what we learned about that word earlier today — a sudden, freakish, turning of the mind,
- 180 on a whim, a capricious change of sentiment. (Makes you wonder how she could have so
- 181 quickly turned on the traditional American Thanksgiving Day story and bought this
- 182 vicious account. Makes you think perhaps her heart had been preconditioned to believe
- 183 anything vile or evil about America as founded, ave?)
- 184 So now, the story is that, 1) It is the pilgrims who were barbaric savages; 2) The 185 traditional 1621 peaceful and unified three-day Thanksgiving feast with the Indians is an
- 186 unreliable account because it has only in two relatively short primary sources. The
- 187 statement of a Separatist (Ana-Baptist) who traveled on the Mayflower in 1620, and 188
- William Bradford, Gov. of the Plymouth Colony. 3) Then they say 19th century
- 189 Americans invented the traditional Thanksgiving story. Supposedly, these nefarious lying 190 educators and writers revised the tale to unify our divided country during the Civil War
- 191 era (Huh???—I know these liars have to stretch to find support for their conclusions, but!
- 192 These guys, who never met one of those people, can divine their intentions and 193
- motivations so, they have a letter written by one of them stating this was their 194 purpose? NOPE! Nothing like that! It's like Schiff's witnesses; they just add 2+2 and get
- 195 104— but I discussed INFERENTIAL MATHEMATICS last time, and we have no time to
- 196 reprise).

- 197 Anyway, the fourth step in their reeducation syllabus was to assert that, 4) America's 198 founders and framers (like George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Benjamin 199 Franklin) were virtually silent about the impact of the Pilgrims or the First Thanksgiving, 200 "further proving the event was fictitious." So, they resort to that good ole argument from 201 silence routine. It's too bad that our children are not given a truly classical education 202 where they are taught logic and how to identify specious arguments so they can see 203 through this foolishness. Anytime someone depends on what no one said as evidence for 204 what they are trying to say, you know their argument is weak.
- Well, is there any truth to their claims? Well, it's sort of like global warming or "climate change." It just depends on to whom you are talking, and which "experts" are bending your ear.
- Dr. Bangs was the chief curator at Plymouth Plantation. He has served as a distinguished visiting professor at Arizona State University. He is a recognized scholar that has authored over ten books on the era of the Pilgrims and Puritans.
- The esteemed doctor-of-all-things-Pilgrim wrote a defense against those who try to debunk the original Thanksgiving story: "The Truth About Thanksgiving is that the Debunkers are Wrong."
- 214 And, in typical liberal-dodge-the-real-issue fashion, if one of these Marxist-loving, God-215 hating Thanksgiving "bunkers" is challenged to PROVE their allegations against our fond 216 memories of history lessons in the bygone days when our teachers loved America as 217 founded and taught us to love our country too — they say, "Was the 'first Thanksgiving' 218 merely a pretext for bloodshed, enslavement, and displacement that would follow in later 219 decades?' "To ask whether this is true is to ask the wrong question. It's true to its 220 purposes. ... And that's all it needs to be. For these holidays say much less about who we 221 really were in some specific Then, than about who we want to be in an ever-changing 222 Now."
 - Uh-huh! I can see some heads exploding out there—intuitively, you know this is bunkotalk. If you are asking whether what these nay-sayers against Christian settlement of this country are correct you ask the "wrong question." It does not matter if the details are accurate what matters is that the historical narrative is "true to its purposes." It was true to the "purposes" of those nefarious men and women who crafted the original tale, and the new revision serves our purpose now all that matters is that it serves its purpose. I'm telling you folks this is what passes of intelligence today. pure assumption — you are watching this sort of thing right now in the Trump impeachment hearings. Surmises — based on circumstantial evidence — the kind of thing this country has famously decried and denounced — but the liberals are poison. They are polluting our culture with their devious and wicked systematic lies and distortions, destroying the foundations of liberty by destroying the concepts of TRUTH, of JUSTICE, and by denigrating through distortion the AMERICAN WAY!

Just remember that this "American way" is what has given you LIBERTY, while their way — Marxist Socialism — has always led to tyranny and widespread bloodshed.

This new idea that the original Thanksgiving was a celebration of murdering Indians is debunked by one of their own witnesses. Professor Dr. David J. Silverman of George Washington University is a specialist in Native American, Colonial American, and American racial history. He wrote a book, "This Land Is Their Land: The Wampanoag Indians, Plymouth Colony, and the Troubled History of Thanksgiving War." In it, he admits the first Thanksgiving meal was peaceful. But he knows the underlying motives of the Pilgrims and the Indians. He divines this motivation by noticing certain facts like later the Indians used their connections with Europeans to secure weapons. So, it must be the case the only reason the Indians cozied up to the Pilgrim settlers and taught them how to plant, and so forth, was "because the [Wampanoag] wanted allies and access to European military weapons" just in case they needed to defend themselves against their rivals, the Narragansett. Not a very flattering picture of these Indians — my Grammar school teacher was much more friendly to them and their memory.

But there is still this nagging and very disturbing question, why didn't our Framers speak about the significance of the Plymouth landing?

Dr. West wrote an excellent article, "We're Living on the Plymouth Rock," which explains what clever liars these "bunkers" really are.

For example, the dear Dr. West points out what I had the pleasure to discover some years ago when I conducted a thorough study of the history of Thanksgiving Day. The Pilgrims of Plymouth were revered and remembered — not so much in the "federal" laws of our land, but virtually everywhere in the local customs of the people. As for State recognition of the significance of the Plymouth landing and that first Thanksgiving feast, New York kicked it off, and several states followed the example, setting aside a certain day as a day of Thanksgiving, commemorating our Pilgrim forebears, as early as 1817. In periodicals, newspapers, speeches, and books, the Pilgrims were remembered, and their memory cherished.

On the occasion of the 200th anniversary of the landing, when the good people of the State stamped the famous rock with the date, 1620, Daniel Webster helped memorialize the landing site with a speech, "The First Settlement in New England" — that was December 20, 1820. In that speech, Webster also memorialized many of the key features in the Thanksgiving feast narrative as we have received it.

- 278 By the way, in this speech, Webster took a swipe at wicked slavery—he argued that the 279 sentiments shaped by the beliefs of these early pioneers would be appalled by slavery— 280 and would wish it opposed by any who honored their memory. How fitting that Abraham 281 Lincoln, who led the nation to honor the anti-slavery sentiment alive in the bosom of 282 every true Christian, would be the one who would establish Thanksgiving as a national 283 holiday.
- 284 David Barton has a fantastic website where all sorts of documentation can be found 285 supporting our traditional view of American history. Go to www.Wallbuilders.com.
- 286 One document in particular: "Historical Account of Thanksgiving," [is worth your time 287 to check out. [Chuck Norris also invites you to check out Barton's video presentations, 288 like the "History of Thanksgiving," and to listen to the Wallbuilders LIVE radio 289 broadcasts — and I concur! Barton is an excellent resource, and he can be trusted. He 290 does not traffic in the fake-news type stories but stays with what can be corroborated — 291 he is an honest student of our history. Check him out!]
- 292 Then there are always the non-religious who are experts on religion when it comes to 293 bunking the American people out of their religious holidays. Here is one yahoo, a reputed 294 expert on the subject, Rick Shenkman, who tells us Thanksgiving could not have been a 295 religious holiday because "the Pilgrims would never have invited the Indians to join 296 them," that's 1. Then, 2, "the pilgrims would never have tolerated festivities at a true 297 religious event." And so, this "proves" the famous feast at Plymouth Rock was merely a 298 harvest festival. From his article, "Top 10 Myths about Thanksgiving."4
- 299 [It's almost cute if the subterfuge was not so ugly.] He adds, as if this aside adds some 300 weight to his argument, "besides, they celebrated on different days, not just November."
- 301 Unreal! But you have to be patient with ignorant unbelievers.
- 302 Okay, first, anyone familiar with Jewish feast days knows they were feast days that were 303 observed as religious events. Then, those special people who are in the know are aware of 304 such esoteric and dark hidden secrets, such as, Christianity is a development out of 305 Judaism. I know that's a startling revelation to many, but I can't help your ignorance if 306 you won't take at least a little time to look at the facts. Haha! I mean, it's truly stunning 307 how ignorant these people about our heritage, much less our faith.
- 308 For example, the Feast of Tabernacles, called Sukkoth (Deuteronomy 16: 13-14), was a 309 feast that continued for seven days.
- 310 And the Jews were commanded to include the "stranger" in their activities if any were 311 among them.
- 312 [And, by the way, the Pilgrims brought to these shores their memories from Leiden,
- 313 Holland. Every October 3, they held a feast commemorating the lifting of the Siege of
- 314 Leiden in 1574. Half the town died in that siege. If you read the account, the hand of

- PROVIDENCE was so evident in their deliverance from the oppressing Spaniards it will inspire and grow your faith⁵ as Norris observed, an obvious parallel with the
- 317 experience of the Pilgrims in the winter of 1620-21.
- 318 Listen, virtually every gathering of believers will include an acknowledgment of GOD, of
- Christ, of the TRUTH of GOD's WORD, it will be attended with PRAYER, and so on. It
- was the center of their every day lives—as it is in our homes today. Good night.] We don't
- 321 start a birthday party without bowing for a moment of prayer and thanksgiving to God.
- I need to close: Chuck Norris recommends we read what he considers a "stellar
- description of the Christian religious life and practice of the original Pilgrims and
- 324 Separatists." You'll find it at the Plimoth Planation's website: "Faith of the Pilgrims."
- Norris recommends we all read it around our Thanksgiving tables. It's here,

- 327 My dear friends don't let them take the happy out of Happy Thanksgiving or the
- 328 Merry out of Merry Christmas —
- I have lit the lamps in the Church belfry arch, and now you let me know if you see them.
- 330 It's LIGHTS ON if you see the LIGHTS ARE ON and you will ride like Revere and spread
- the warning, (essentially, it means you agree with what I'm saying), or you say LIGHTS
- OFF -- which means you reject what I'm saying and disagree strongly with me. So, what
- will it be today, lights on, or lights off?
