

Brain Massage®: Show No. 763 The Impeachment Examined Under The
Microscope of Scripture / What Should We Expect?

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1 Segment.01 Hello. I'm Dr. Jerry Scheidbach, pastor of the
2 Lighthouse Baptist Church in Santa Maria, CA—and your brain
3 masseur—get ready for your brain massage.

4 The Impeachment trial — you might be getting tired of this, but let
5 me assure you, the angle at which I'm approaching this will
6 surprise you, enlighten you, and motivate you!!!

7 Illegal immigration is a really big problem and it is very relevant to
8 Election 2020.

9 Why do they hate Trump? The obvious answers—he beat Hillary,
10 he is a loose cannon they can't control, he is a threat to the globalist
11 agenda, he is pro-America, he is exposing Democrat corruption,
12 threatening the Cabal of the Biden/Hillary crime families, exposing
13 the ineptness of the Democrat Party over all but over and above all
14 of that — well, now we are beginning to get to the heart of Trump
15 hatred. Wait for it!

16 My friends, it's time for your brain massage!

17 [TRUTH]

18 Impeachment trial:

19 I posted a link to Levin's excellent "opening statement to the
20 Senate" and you really should listen to the entire monologue. Levin
21 is an expert on the Constitution, and he knows history—he lays out
22 the case for Trump powerfully. I intend to borrow from some of
23 his insights today—but, of course, I'll deepen the insight, cause,
24 after all, I'm the brain masseur. (haha—but really!)

25 I thought about taking Schiff's statement and picking it apart—but
26 it's just boring. A few general observations will suffice: first, he
27 arrogates to himself something like omniscience — he knows

28 Trump's motivations, and offers his interpretation of Trump's
29 behavior as if his interpretations are evidence, but not once does he
30 offer anything remotely resembling actionable evidence, or proof.
31 At least in the Declaration of Independence, when the Framers put
32 forth their denunciations of King George, they followed with
33 documented evidence of wrongdoing — they pointed to specific
34 deeds done that supported their allegations. This did not happen
35 with Schifty — not one specific incidence of wrongdoing was
36 presented that is supportable by anything any court would call
37 evidence.

38 Do you want proof that the Democrats presented a case that is not
39 supported by proof? They are clamoring for the Senate to call up
40 witnesses they never called, and tasking the Senate with
41 investigating their allegations. They think the Congress is a grand
42 jury that approves an indictment and the Senate is the court where
43 the case is tried. That's not how the Framers set up the
44 impeachment process. It's more like the "case" for impeachment is
45 built in the Congress, and then the Senate rules it on, that is, the
46 Senate decides the sentence. The better analogy to a court
47 proceeding would be the Congress sets the case before the Jury and
48 the Jury decides the verdict: the Senate functions more like the Jury
49 in this situation.

50 If impeachment were something the Framers thought should be
51 adjudicated in our courts, they would not have crafted the
52 impeachment clause. They made impeachment a Constitutional
53 function providing for a Congressional check on the Executive,
54 while at the same time providing certain protections to the
55 Executive against being harassed by a Partisan Congress bent on
56 impeding an unpopular rival to their Party in the execution of his
57 executive responsibilities. The Judicial branch serves only in a
58 supervisory role—the chief justice "manages the proceeding." But
59 he has no vote in the sentencing, and nothing more than a polite

60 recognition of his expertise when called for. So, essentially,
61 impeachment is left to Congress — the House of Representatives
62 impeaches, and the Senate acts on the impeachment.

63 So, it's not a court of law — which is what the Democrats argued
64 when they made decisions like refusing to allow Republicans to call
65 witnesses of their own choosing, but arrogantly presuming to
66 justify calling only their own witnesses, and then refusing to allow
67 Republicans to cross examine these witnesses without constant
68 interruption. The Democrats said, well, yes, this would never be
69 allowed in a courtroom, but this is not a courtroom, so we can do
70 these things. No kidding, that was their argument. It's not a court
71 of law, this is a political proceeding; so, we don't have to follow the
72 rules of a court. Hmmm?

73 How about following the rules of the Constitution? The standard
74 for impeachment is treason, bribery, or "other high crimes and
75 misdemeanors." The precedent for "high crime" apparently does
76 not include specific crimes like lying under oath. At least that's
77 what the Senate hearing the trial of Clinton decided. They said his
78 crimes did not reach the level of "high crimes and misdemeanors."
79 Eleven felony counts against Clinton—this did not attain to the
80 level of impeachable offense. So the Senate then censured the
81 President for lying under oath — and afterwards, the Bar removed
82 Clinton's license to practice law, but beyond that, nothing.

83 So, if precedent matters — Trump deserves to be acquitted with
84 prejudice against the charges laid against him.

85 And how about general rules of decorum, honor, fairness,
86 openness, transparency? Should the Democrat Party controlled
87 Congress at least be answerable to these honest expectations of the
88 public they serve? I think so. Keep this in mind!

89 Now the House sends the articles of impeachment to the Senate,
90 and argues that the Senate should proceed as a court of law — it

91 should call witnesses, investigate charges, and so forth. But the
92 Senate is not a court of law! It also is a political body charged with
93 duties to protect the Constitution.

94 What the Democrats want the Senate to do is violate the
95 Constitutional protections afforded to the Executive to protect it
96 from political harassment from the opposition Party.

97 In the past, if the Congress wanted to compel the Executive to
98 deliver documents to Congress, or to release Cabinet members to
99 testify to Congress, the Congress had to sue in a court of law —
100 they had to turn to the third branch of power and ask for a ruling
101 from the court to compel the Executive to yield to Congressional
102 demands.

103 A Democrat, I forget his name right now, but one of the Democrat
104 Party's so-called "impeachment managers" explained why the
105 Congress did not want to go to the courts to compel the Executive
106 to give up its Constitutional privileges and comply with the
107 ongoing harassment of our President by this Democrat Party
108 controlled House. It was because then they could not impeach
109 before the election. Ergo — the point was to impeach Trump
110 BEFORE THE ELECTION — which means *this is the Democrat*
111 *election strategy for 2020*. Who is interfering with our elections
112 now?

113 So, the point thus far is that the Democrat Party is using
114 impeachment as their campaign strategy for 2020. They did not
115 have sufficient evidence to support their allegations of bribery, or
116 treason, so they invented two offenses they claim are impeachable
117 offenses. Let's look at them.

118 Obstruction of Congress, and Abuse of Power.

119 The basis of the charge that Trump obstructed Congress is that he
120 refused to participate in their lynching. He refused to put his neck
121 in their mob made noose. In other words, he exercised the

122 Constitutional prerogatives of his office in the manner anticipated
123 by the Framers — he refused to allow the Party-Petty Democrats
124 access to his documents and cabinet and staff to go on a fishing
125 expedition looking for something they could make a case out of.
126 Sort of like the phone call between him and Zelenski, privileged
127 communication, by the way, it's actually a violation of LAW to
128 divulge such communications, but Trump released it to expose the
129 liars for what they are, and it perfectly illustrates why the Framers
130 provided this protection for the Executive. The Congress has to
131 come up with proof of "high crimes and misdemeanors" they know
132 about, without requiring the President to allow them to look for
133 something they can use to fabricate a case — like they are doing
134 with the phone call.

135 But the wicked demon controlled Democrats want to have their
136 closed door sessions, leaking only what they want the public to
137 hear, and if demanded to produce the full transcripts of those
138 closed door, secret hearings, they claim CONGRESSIONAL
139 PRIVILEGE. So, you see! When it comes to politics, a PARTISAN
140 cares nothing for fairness, honesty, transparency — nothing
141 matters but one thing, gain and keep power for their PARTY.
142 Period!

143 So when you hear these liars try to morph the charge from
144 "obstruction of Congress," to "obstruction of justice," you need to
145 immediately correct that lie. Trump is not charged with
146 obstructing justice, he is accused of EXERCISING HIS
147 CONSTITUTIONAL POWERS OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE to
148 protect Presidency from harassment from a partisan attack from
149 Congress. And it works! In many ways, what you are watching is
150 how well our Constitution works to protect us from coups, protects
151 us from partisan politicians who care nothing for the Constitution,
152 but would trample all over it to get and keep power over our
153 government.

154 Remember, the violent take power by force — they take it! If you
155 refuse to give it to them, they use force, either the force of party
156 politics, or, if necessary, force of arms, they will TAKE power by
157 VIOLENCE. That's why they call for violence — Waters screeching
158 about getting in our faces and shouting us down telling us we don't
159 belong in their world — it's theirs and we have no say! That's their
160 way. They are violent people — it's in their soul to be violent and to
161 use violence to advance their agenda — it's why they love abortion.
162 It's a violent way to advance their agenda. It's why one of Bernie's
163 campaign workers calls for violence, warning, if Bernie does not
164 win, there will be violence. It's why they threaten violence if Trump
165 is reelected. They are violent people. Keep that in mind.

166 There is another kind of violence. The violence of maliciously
167 twisting the words of another, the violence of misrepresenting what
168 Trump actually said in that phone call, remember Schiff
169 mischaracterizing the conversation in a wicked effort to plant an
170 evil version of the conversation in the Congressional record and in
171 the minds of those hearing him — the man is a devil! He has the
172 look of one demon possessed.

173 Anyway, you see it, surely! The Congress has the power to
174 impeach, and requires only a simple majority to do so.

175 But the Senate has the power to rule on the impeachment. Its
176 responsibility is to evaluate the case presented to it by the
177 Congress. And there is no case.

178 There is no obstruction. Congress does not have the right to
179 demand the Executive participate in their witch-hunts—.

180 The second charge, abuse of power, is ambiguous. Anyone who
181 does not like what someone in power does will allege abuse of
182 power. Levin outlined several actions by past presidents that
183 virtually any reasonable mind would agree constitutes abuse of
184 power, I'll review them in the next segment. Policy disagreements,

185 and decisions about firing certain staff, or ambassadors, these are
186 privileges of the office and exercising the prerogatives of office does
187 not constitute an abuse of power.

188 George Mason and James Madison are two of my favorite
189 founders. They actually had a disagreement on this matter. Mason
190 wanted to include maladministration as an impeachable offense.
191 Madison immediately saw the danger of using such a broad,
192 ambiguous term. He said such a standard would make the
193 President serve at the pleasure of the Senate. And so the idea was
194 rejected. Any political party that did not like the way the President
195 conducted or executed the duties of his office could be charged
196 maladministration. The proof would be only their opinion that he
197 did so. It would invite exactly the sort of thing we are experiencing
198 now.

199 But our present Congress does not subordinate itself to the Law of
200 our Land — they don't care about the rule of LAW, they care only
201 for the RULE OF DEMOCRATS. That's it! If anyone in this
202 debacle is acting as if they are above the law, it is the Democrats.

203 They manipulate the law, they use the rules, they capitalize on
204 every loophole they can find, or create, they maneuver just like
205 devils do under the LAW of GOD. I'll explain that in the next
206 segment. I've got to take a short break. I'll be right back.

207 Segment.02 Hello. Welcome back! I'm Dr. Jerry Scheidbach, pastor
208 at the Lighthouse, your brain masseur, and Paul Revere's lantern
209 lighter, lighting the lamps in the church belfry arch, signaling the
210 enemy is on the march, an enemy that would steal from us our
211 liberty.

212 Okay, so, the Senate decided they would not compel the Executive
213 to release privileged records or attempt to compel the President to
214 release cabinet or staff to testify. If the Congress wanted that, they
215 should have gone to court as Assemblies have done before them.

216 The fact that it did not serve their POLITICAL objectives, to get
217 Trump impeached before the election, is totally IRRELEVANT to
218 the Senate. Good for them.

219 But mind you, it's only because the Senate is under the control of
220 Republicans who think like the Framers did about these things.

221 Now, the Senate will hear the case Congress is proposing, and hear
222 the rebuttal from the President's supporters, and his lawyers, and
223 then rule on the articles. That's what is going on. And right now,
224 the prosecution has had the floor, and they made no case. Now, the
225 DEFENSE has the floor.

226 So, what can we expect?

227 We can expect that when the DEFENSE against these baseless
228 charges is heard, the Democrats will scream, "cover-up." They
229 protest the loudest when accusing others of doing what they are
230 actually doing. This whole thing is a cover up, all right! It's an
231 effort on the part of the Demoncrats to cover for the crime boss,
232 Biden, Clinton, for Obama.

233 Soon we will hear that the Republicans in the Senate are
234 "obstructing Congress." Yeah! Watch for it! They will argue that it's
235 the "right" of the Congress to impeach, and it's wrong for the
236 Senate, controlled by partisan politics, to obstruct them by denying
237 conviction. They will argue that Senate acted purely as partisans —
238 that they did it only to protect Trump. They will accuse the Senate
239 of attempting to control the outcome of the 2020 election. Expect
240 all of this. You watch. These people are truly that crazy, or, should I
241 say, they are that demonic.

242 Nevertheless, you can expect the Senate to do the reasonable thing
243 and acquit Trump. And then for the Congress to initiate yet
244 another impeachment inquiry — they already signaled this. They
245 are talking about "new evidence" that has supposedly surfaced. And

246 one of their big mouths has already told us what to expect —
247 Waters declared the Congress will impeach Trump again.

248 Think about this! The Democrat controlled Congress is doing
249 exactly what I warned you they would do if they regained power in
250 the Congress. They have one agenda, get Trump! That's it! Nothing
251 else matters to them.

252 Listen, this Congress has sat for two years and done not one single
253 thing except harass the President continually, with false allegations,
254 lies, based on their resentment that he beat Hillary and fear that if
255 not gotten out of office, he will uncover the whole demoncrat cabal
256 that has been milking the American people for billions in graft, and
257 payola, and siphoning off hundreds of millions in deal making with
258 foreign governments—they are absolutely terrified that a rogue,
259 like Donald Trump, will blow their cover.

260 On top of that, they are panicked about what a Trump presidency
261 will do to their globalist, communist conspiracy to reduce
262 American dominance in the world, take the "sword of vengeance"
263 God put into the hands of this nation under God and turn it
264 against CHRISTIANS, against AMERICA AS FOUNDED, and use
265 it to support the globalist agenda, against Israel, against American
266 liberty, in favor of the antichrist agenda, and in opposition to the
267 agenda of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, which is LIBERTY and
268 JUSTICE FOR ALL — peace on earth, good will toward man.

269 Allow me to use the next few minutes to pierce the darkness, to
270 shine some LIGHT of TRUTH on what's going on in America right
271 now, staged before us in this effort of the House to get rid of
272 Trump.

273 I know a lot of Christians don't like Trump. When Schiff begins his
274 statement with a quote from Alexander Hamilton, in which that
275 fine patriot expressed concern that "a man unprincipled in private
276 life desperate in his fortune, bold in his temper, possessed of

277 considerable talents, having the advantage of military habits—
278 despotic in his ordinary demeanour—known to have scoffed in
279 private at the principles of liberty—when such a man is seen to
280 mount the hobby horse of popularity—to join in the cry of danger
281 to liberty—to take every opportunity of embarrassing the General
282 Government & bringing it under suspicion—to flatter and fall in
283 with all the non sense of the zealots of the day — it may justly be
284 suspected that his object is to throw things into confusion that he
285 may 'ride the storm and direct the whirlwind.'" Anyone
286 knowledgeable of Obama's legacy would think it was him being
287 described.

288 But Schiff knows that Trump's unusual manners befuddle the
289 "gentry," he scorns the snobs; he shows open disdain for the
290 "aristos" and talks like the common man. He walks among the real
291 soldiers of American enterprise, the people, the real people who
292 make America work, the working class adore him, the little
293 people—he is one of us. He does not talk like the "rulers" the
294 pontificating snobs who think themselves better than us. He comes
295 across like a neighbor you have coffee with — joking with us, and
296 not making us the joke. No President has been more approachable,
297 and none have taken the mantle of champion for America, the
298 America we grew up in — finally, someone has come along who
299 represents us, the people who make America, who continue to hold
300 the values and cherish the ideals that made America great, and so
301 he has come along to MAKE AMERICA GREAT AGAIN! It
302 resonates with us because we know America is great, that many
303 have come along to paint America as a loser, as failed, as a joke to
304 the European snobs — but we know better. We know what we are,
305 and who we are. And we have deeply resented having a president
306 who went on his apology tour, who apologized for America, who
307 embarrassed us in the world — Trump sees us the way we see us.

308 Incredible that Schiff would read this and see Trump. I read it and
309 see Clinton, Obama, him, Pelosi, BIDEN — crime boss Biden.

310 They need Biden in office like they needed Clinton there — to
311 protect the Corruption Cabal — to keep the money flowing into
312 the coffers of America's enemies, to keep the antichrist agenda
313 funded, and moving forward toward the goal of reducing America
314 to a third rate dictatorship.

315 Who has scoffed in private at the principles of liberty? Obama has,
316 Clinton has, Schiff is himself a mockery of the principles of liberty.
317 He has trampled upon virtually every American ideal of justice,
318 and judgment, and equity: guilty until proven innocent — no
319 allowance for a defense — wickedly distorting the statements of the
320 target of his vendetta against justice, and against the people that
321 voted for the opponent of the candidate he preferred.

322 Schiff was describing himself. And that's the way it is with these
323 people today. They are guilty for every charge they have fabricated
324 against Trump.

325 So, what is this all about?

326 Well, like I said, of course there are all the obvious answers—he
327 beat Hillary and this deprived Schiff of his dream job in Hillary's
328 administration, Trump is a loose cannon the arrogant government
329 Aristos can't control, he is upsetting the applecart of the status-quo,
330 he is pro-America, he is exposing Democrat corruption,
331 threatening the Cabal of the Biden/Hillary crime families,
332 threatening to drain the swamp and that threatens thousands of
333 bureaucrats who serve and support the cabal, he is exposing the
334 ineptness of the Democrat Party who, for example, have got
335 nothing done in this Congress except to impeach a President who
336 has done more for our economy and liberty than any president in
337 recent history, but over and above all of that — he is the Christian's
338 champion, he is leading the charge against those that rage: "let us

339 break their bands asunder and cast away their cords from us," he
340 was elected to office by many, but the base of his support is
341 evangelical Christians who see in him a representation of the
342 typical American, a real person who understands the fundamentals
343 of what makes America work, who stands as a shield protecting us
344 from the efforts of the wicked and unreasonable who want to take
345 away our liberties, Christians can identify with him because they
346 too, like all humans, have flaws, and weaknesses, but we cherish the
347 ideal of American values — only the silly, superficial Christianette
348 is so deeply offended by Trump's persona that they can't see past it
349 to the core values that actuate this man, the move him and shape
350 him— he is not blinded by the spirit of darkness prevailing on the
351 left, political correctness, the nonsense of gender confusion, the
352 darkness of abortion—anyone who can know what abortion is and
353 support it today is a dark soul indeed. There is no longer any
354 pretense about fetus, or blob of tissue — they will murder a full
355 term baby and fist bump, high five, and say, been there, done that,
356 and got the T-Shirt — the evil of such hearts is the evil of
357 auschwitz, it's the darkness of Nazi Germany reprised, it's the same
358 spirit that would rationalize reeducation camps to indoctrinate
359 Christians against Christ the KING, and that would kill those who
360 refuse to be so indoctrinated.

361 I tell you, it is the spirit of antichrist raging against the Spirit of
362 Jesus Christ.

363 Characteristics of those motivated, controlled, influenced by the
364 spirit of antichrist.

365 Satan loves to shed the innocent blood of infants — remember
366 Herod who sent the soldiers into Ramah to murder all babies 2
367 year and under. Watch for this crowd to begin calling for a parents
368 right to murder their children after giving birth — Oh, wait, that's
369 already happening. Northam, the adversary of our second
370 amendment, said this in answer to a question about a very

371 controversial abortion bill in Virginia: "if a mother is in labor, I can
372 tell you exactly what would happen. The infant would be delivered,
373 the infant would be kept comfortable, the infant would be
374 resuscitated if that's what the mother and the family desired, and
375 then a discussion would ensue between the physicians and the
376 mother. So I think this was really blown out of proportion." Really!
377 It's out of proportion all right—outside the bounds of anything like
378 a regard for human life—protection for the most vulnerable
379 humans, the infant. Monstrous!

380 Such people rage against biblical Christians. Such people have an
381 innate hatred of biblical Christians. They squirm in our LIGHT
382 and are agitated by our SALT — the resentment of these people
383 against us cannot be accounted for by reason. It's irrational to want
384 to allow for the murder of babies. It's unnatural, it's counter to the
385 most basic of human instincts. Only one thing accounts for it.

386 Another characteristic of the antichrist spirit is suspicion against
387 anyone having power to protect themselves. Typical antichrist
388 doctrine is 180 degrees out of phase with Jesus' trust of His
389 disciples, and his instruction that they should get a sword — and
390 we know that was not for advancing the Kingdom of God on earth
391 — it was for self protection in a hostile world where the violent
392 take by force the liberties GOD ordained to every person created in
393 His image. It was for DEFENSE, not for aggression.

394 They do not trust anyone with a gun except themselves, except
395 those under their control. Every society governed by the spirit of
396 antichrist does not want the people to bear arms. Check it out!
397 Every place where Christianity is hated, they want to kill babies,
398 and they want to deprive citizens from having arms for self-
399 protection.

400 Government control over virtually every aspect of your life. This is
401 a sure marker of the antichrist spirit. Jesus Spirit is all about
402 LIBERTY. It's about trusting citizens with making their own

403 decisions about what they believe, and how best to pursue their
404 own happiness. The Antichrist spirit sees anyone who resists the
405 government telling them what to believe, and how to pursue their
406 own happiness as a threat to their control. Christian nations grant
407 freedom, that the antichrist spirit attempts to turn against us — but
408 when they cross the line, and begin encroaching on our liberties,
409 on our freedoms, that's when we say, thus far, and no farther.

410 Globalism — the antichrist spirit is always working to unite the
411 world under a single head or power that will control all the assets
412 of the planet as tyrants.

413 Well, I'm running out of time. I can show you from the Bible that
414 these things are characteristic of the spirit of antichrist.

415 Do you want to know why they hate Trump so much? His policies
416 go against the spirit of antichrist. His policies reflect those of the
417 Spirit of Jesus Christ. He acknowledges God, and Christ, and any
418 self-righteous "Christianette" from Christianity Today who
419 pretends he is sufficiently righteous to cast stones at what by all
420 accounts is a growing Christian is disgusting to grace, and full of
421 the sort of pride that God resists. Trump governs according to the
422 principles of LIBERTY as conceived by our FOUNDERS and set
423 upon the foundation of Christian faith — and that's why they rage,
424 and scream, and cut themselves, and stab themselves, and go stark
425 raving mad — the devils in them hate the SPIRIT OF CHRIST that
426 is encouraged and strengthened in the land under the leadership of
427 this President.
